Applications may be submitted via fax or email, and must be received by April 30, 2010.

All RNS Summer Camp Instructors will work under the supervision of the Camp Director to ensure that all campers have a safe, healthy and positive environment.

JOB DESCRIPTION: RING SKILLS INSTRUCTOR

Qualifications:

- Minimum 18 years of age or older at the time of the camps.
- Must have sound knowledge of the rules of ringette, at least 4 years experience as a ringette coach with a minimum of Level 2 or Competitive Introduction and Gradation coaching certification, and strong skating ability.
- Proven ability to teach ringette and skating skills to young children.
- Leadership experience in school, sports, or the community.
- Proven ability to work with little supervision or guidance.

General Responsibilities:

- Responsible for the development, planning and coordination of a week long on-ice ring skills program to be presented to Camp Director at least two weeks prior to start of camp.
- Responsible for leading activities in the three daily hours of ring skill development ice time.
- Provides supervision and guidance to Senior and Junior Camp Instructors assigned to group during ring skill instruction sessions.
- Monitors campers' well-being, safety and skill development while conducting on ice ring skill sessions.
- Reports any accidents or injuries to the Camp Director.
- Acts as an appropriate role model for children through actions, language, work habits and general conduct.
- Attends and participates in all camp staff meetings.
- Present at the program site for three hours daily to lead and conduct the on ice ringette skills instruction.

- Responsible for leading activities in the three daily hours of power skating ice time.
- Provides supervision and guidance to Senior and Junior Camp Instructors assigned to group during power skating instruction sessions.
- Monitors campers' well-being, safety and skill development while conducting on ice power skating sessions.
- Reports any accidents or injuries to the Camp Director.
- Acts as an appropriate role model for children through actions, language, work habits and general conduct.
- Attends and participates in all camp staff meetings.
- Present at the program site for three hours daily to lead and conduct the on ice power skating instruction.
